What is the Sports Grant?

The government is providing additional funding to improve provision of physical education (PE) and sport in primary schools. This funding - provided jointly by the Departments for Education, Health and Culture, Media and Sport – has been allocated to primary schools.

This funding is ring-fenced and therefore can only be spent on provision of PE and sport in schools.

Each school is free to determine how best to use this funding.

Aims of Sports Premium Funding at Prees C.E. Primary School and Nursery:

Increased percentage of children taking part in extra-curricular sport.
 Increased percentage of children taking part in competitive sport.
 Increased percentage of children achieving end of year expectations in PE.
 Increased range of sports and activities offered.

Water skills and confidence is embedded. Of parent questionnaires returned (15 in total), all children feel more confident in the water-100% engagement in swimming.</p> <p>100% of children in year 6 could swim 25 metres.</p> <p>100% of children in year 6 could use a range of strokes effectively.</p> <p>71% of children in year 6 could perform safe self-rescue in a variety of water-based situations.</p>
Reading the Game Literacy/football programme delivered by STFC	£300	Year 3 children to develop football skills and sporting skills.	<p>Year 3 children develop football skills.</p> <p>Children can talk about how skills developed in the classroom can impact on sporting activities.</p> <p>Increased enjoyment.</p>
Employment of PE specialist	£4,000	<p>To experience a wide range of sports.</p> <p>To experience high level coaching in a variety of sports.</p>	<p>More opportunities for all our pupils in both Key Stages. Teacher coaching for sustainability.</p> <p>Wider range of sports taught – greater awareness for the children of different sports available to them.</p> <p>High quality CPD for staff</p>
Purchase equipment	£500	To update and purchase supplementary equipment to resource lessons when necessary.	Children will be able to access equipment that is fit for purpose.
Increased participation in competitive sports	£700 + £650 (transport)	To enable children to take part in more teams and competitions	<p>More children will be able to compete in competitive individual and team sports.</p> <p>Teams have taken part in competitive sporting activities such as football/cricket.</p>

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Cover	£1500	To provide cover for children to attend festivals, swimming and out of school competitions	<p>Children are able to access a wide range of festivals, swimming and competitions due to the fact that adult cover is available.</p> <p>All children in Key Stage 1 and 2 participated in a wider range of tournaments and swimming lessons due to cover being in place.</p>
Lease of minibus	£3200 + 400 (fuel)	To provide transport to and from sporting venues and allow children transport to their homes as needed.	<p>Increased participation in sport. More pupils able to access competition.</p> <p>Teams were able to enter competitions – transport provided by minibus enabled children to travel to and from venues and also provide transport home.</p>
Forest School	£3000 + £200 (training)	To provide 1 x Forest School session per week for children from Nursery to year 3.	<p>Children have access to outdoor learning and learn how to take risks, work as a team, learn from mistakes and solve problems.</p> <p>All children accessed Forest School sessions and felt much more confident to take risks when working outdoors.</p>
Transport	£600	More children able to attend sporting festivals and competitions.	<p>Increased participation in sport. More pupils able to access competition.</p> <p>All children in KS 1 and 2 accessed at least two competitions in 2017/2018</p>
